Keynote Address: Museums in the Digital Age Monday, April 13 • 9:30 a.m.

To listen to the way the Internet and digital technologies are talked about within museum circles and beyond them, it is easy to get the impression that they have changed everything about what the museum sector does. How true is this? Where have digital technologies really impacted museum work, and where have the differences been exaggerated?

In this presentation, Museopunks Jeffrey Inscho and Suse Cairns will unpack some of the mythologies and realities about the museum in the digital age. They will draw on examples from across the sector and beyond it to look at where real change lies, and consider how museums can temper the rhetoric of technology to find the actuality behind it. Museopunks is a podcast for the progressive museum.

Each month, passionate practitioners Jeffrey Inscho and Suse Cairns tackle prominent issues and big ideas facing museums in the modern age. Since April 2013, the pair has explored some of the sector's most stimulating questions, institutions, and practices, with a focus on emergent, boundary-pushing work and ideas. Guests have included Sree Sreenivasan (Metropolitan Museum of Art), Michael Edson (Smithsonian), Elizabeth Merritt (Centre for the Future of Museums), and Sharna Jackson (Tate). 
